I hope you find the following information of interest. However, before I tell you about some new developments in hair restoration surgery, I thought it appropriate that I gave you a little of my own history.

To the many thousands of people who have enquired about hair loss related products or services over the years, my name may sound familiar. I have represented the hair restoration industry from the day it first became available in the UK, back in the mid 70s. I initially joined the industry because of my own fear of hair loss, even before I had any loss of my own. I only had to look at my own family history to realise that it was a high on certainty that I would start losing it before reaching my 30th birthday. Realising this, I wanted to be in the best place when it came to making a decision as to what I did about it. So I joined the hair loss industry.

In those days there was only one choice of hair transplant surgery – ‘plug’ surgery. This method involved a doctor ‘drilling’ a small circular area of hair-bearing skin from the back of the head with a ‘Black and Decker’! No kidding! Then they drilled an equivalent ‘plug’ of skin out of the bald area and replaced it with the plug of hair-bearing skin. The

results of the procedure were limited. How do you design a hairline with a series of 4.5mm circles of hair-bearing skin? It is like placing a few pennies close together on a flat surface; there are always going to be gaps.

Fortunately, when it came to my joining the industry in 1974, the clinic group I represented had acquired the services of an Australian surgeon. He came over to the UK to train other groups of prospective ‘hair doctors’ in what was then an almost unknown technology. He also trained me as a young ‘patient consultant’ all those years ago and continues to be my friend and mentor to the present day,

His name is Dr. Richard Shiell MD. Richard went on to become one of the recognised pioneers of the hair transplant industry. Apart from being one of the founders and Governors of the International Society of Hair Restoration Surgeons (ISHRS), Richard has received every award and honour there is, including the highest award in the industry, the ‘Manfred Lucas Award’, which he received in 1999 for lifetime services to the hair transplant profession. This award has only ever been awarded to three others:

- Dr. Norman Orentreich – A recognised pioneer in the very early stages of plug surgery.
- Dr. O’tar Norwood - the man who produced all those little heads we often see depicting various stages of male pattern baldness stage 1V, stage V11 etc. - it is named after him - the Norwood Chart
- Finally, Dr. Sheldon Kabaker, who introduced the ‘Juri flap’ and scalp expansion techniques to many notable hair transplant surgeons. This is a method of ‘swinging’ one’s side hair around in the front scalp to form part of the hairline.

To those of you who, in the course of responding to my advertising or having visited my website, have gotten to know a little about me, there is one thing that I hope comes through clearly. I know the industry intimately and can speak with authority about it. I have successfully combated hair loss for the last 30 years and have done so from strength. I was:

1st to introduce Minoxidil (Regain) to the UK in 1984 through a talk show on Manchester’s ‘Piccadilly Radio’ and have made the hair drugs available to people through my company’s doctors ever since

1st to use Finasteride (Propecia) - a medical paper was published on my use of the ‘new’ drug in 1994, two years after I commenced using it in 1992.

1st to introduce micro grafting surgery to the public in 1994 with my former associates ‘Advanced Hair Technology’.

1st to highlight the Choi technique through extensive advertising in recent years and my own Choi procedure in 2001.

AND NOW 1st TO offer you CONSISTENTLY EXCELLENT RESULTS!

HOW? BY GUARANTEEING YOUR CHOI PROCEDURE IS PERFORMED ONLY BY CHOI TRAINED SPECIALIST SURGEON’S AND THEIR TEAMS.

Without exception, everybody that I have represented over the last 30 years, as his or her patient consultant, has invariably played a leading role in enabling me to 'hold on to my hair'! What better way to represent the hair loss industry than to be able to demonstrate to others the benefits of well planned and well executed hair restoration surgery than on oneself?

Where do you go?

Most men suffering hair loss would die rather than approach their own doctor.

Who do you talk to?

Of course you can call the British Medical Association to check someone's qualifications, even what they specialise in. You can also check them out on the Internet but that won't tell you how happy their previous patients are.

How do you know if 'your' surgeon's work is consistent?

He may have good days and bad days, like the rest of us, but that shouldn't affect his work! - Should it?

Only time can tell me but who's going to tell you?

Ask any clinic about qualifications and they will tell you: "All of our surgeons work to the highest standard and closely adhere to recognised guidelines".

As already discussed, throughout my career I have only represented specialists in this industry by 'example'. If they have been good enough for me, they have to be good enough for even the most discerning of people.

If you take a close look at my hair during a consultation you will see for yourself. Right from my first hair transplant procedure with 'plugs' in 1979, through a further two procedures with microsurgery (1995 and 1998), I had chosen my surgeon's well.

Then finally 2001 and the Choi procedure. The operating team achieved a result on with my hairline work, which is about the closest one can get to nature itself. The surgeon achieved this by planting the single and follicular units so that the front hairline is 'staggered', as opposed to a typical 'straight line' hairline - Often the 'give-away' with conventional surgery.

With the Choi being a needle, the surgeon is able to place one hair fractionally forward or behind the last hair planted achieving a 'staggered' (zigzagged) effect, closely mimicking nature's original design. As any surgeon will tell you, there are no straight lines in nature.

For the past 5 years, I have proudly represented Choi Method of hair restoration surgery. We look forward to being able to demonstrate what a difference this much-advanced technology can offer you in the hands of people who really do care

INTRODUCTION

The Choi Implanter method.

The Choi Implanter method of hair transplantation is internationally accepted as the gold standard in the treatment of premature hair loss.

Developed by a leading Korean surgeon, Professor Kim Choi and named after him, the Choi offers many significant advantages over conventional Microsurgery:

- The surgeon uses a needle to plant the hair, allowing for much closer proximity grafting and increased volume. This means that a 'finished' result can be achieved in a single session.
- Using larger teams of assistants – a prerequisite of the Choi method - means that many thousands of hairs can be planted during one session, generally up to 6,000. Consequently, much larger areas of baldness or thinning areas can be treated on the day.
- The hair can be planted at up to 6mm in length, giving the average patient sufficient length of hair to disguise his treatment throughout the healing period.

At the Milan Hair Convention 2001 in Italy, the Choi method was awarded the first prize for the "BEST PROCEDURE" and the first prize for "BEST RESULTS". A true indication of how hair implantation - with a needle – has advanced in comparison to micro grafting – with a scalpel.

Why isn't Choi available in the UK?

Apart from the operating surgeon, a large team of assistants are required to utilise the Choi method. This makes the procedure far too labour intensive to operate in the UK.



Short on time? We can book you out the day before – Have your treatment on the following day – And fly back the day after! It can be any two-day combination with the exception of weekends.

Alternatively, if like so many others, you would prefer to extend your treatment to a mini-break in the sunshine or a cultural tour of Athens? Where to go, what to see? You only have to ask one or two of our other patients to discover how we have turned what is normally considered a chore – into a pleasurable experience for them. It could be a good opportunity for your wife or partner to have a break too? There are some great shops in Athens and considerably cheaper than our own.

The following information will give you some idea of what to expect on your stay in Athens:

Not only are you about to have the best in hair restoration available anywhere in the world, you are going to be personally looked after by one of our team, Jeff Kay. He's a past master at making people feel at home. He's everybody's 'good buddy' and mine too.

On your arrival, you will be collected from the airport by our driver. He speaks fluent English and is a really good guy. He will take you directly to your apartment, where Jeff Kay and I will meet you for a pre consultation and to discuss your procedure. You will be staying in a beautiful apartment, directly across from the beach on the coast, about 30 minutes out of Athens. You will eat with us, have your procedure with us and see the sites with us, during your 2/3-day trip.

Apart from accompanying you for your day at our clinic, Jeff Kay and I will take you out to dinner to one of our favourite haunts, 'Molly Malone's' in Glyfada. This is the Irish Bar we use to entertain our visitors.



Where you will enjoy superb cooking and a good company. A nice mix of ex pats and Greeks. They also have a They also have a giant TV screen with live coverage of Soccer events, if you're into sport.

The day of your session, Jeff Kay will collect you from your apartment for the drive into Athens. Jeff will be present with you during your procedure and he will also return you to your apartment at the end of your procedure.

You will rest up on the night of your session. You will have no pain and very little discomfort. Our surgeon and his team will supply you with a course of treatment, including, a short course of antibiotics, to protect against infection and a special shampoo, etc. Also, a postoperative list of things you need to know.

The first real 'buzz' you will get, (apart from the realisation that your procedure really was pain free and a doddle) is when you look in the mirror when you get back to your apartment. When you first get to see the 'shape' of things to come.

As the surgery site contains short hairs that have now taken the place of bald or thinning areas. You can visualise what it's going to be like, when the hair has grown.

The following morning, Jeff Kay will collect you from the apartment and take you into Athens. He'll show you around some of the most interesting of the places to visit, so bring a camera with you. That evening, you will eat and have a good night out with us.

The following day, our driver will once again collect you from your apartment and deliver you safe and sound back to the airport.

All costs, food, accommodation, transportation, (including your air fare up to £250) are included in our session charges.

The smaller, up to 3,000-hair procedures take about 2/3 hours to complete. The medium session, up to 4,500 procedures takes 3/4 hours and the larger, up to 6,000 hairs procedure takes 4.5 hour.

The procedure requires a local anaesthetic and you will experience no pain whatsoever – not even any discomfort. Most patients are so relaxed they fall asleep. Others read, watch a movie or listen to music. If you have a particular movie you would like to watch, and then bring it with you. During the evening of your procedure you will relax in your apartment or take a stroll around the area, which is among the most beautiful resorts on the Greek coastline..

Day 3 On the morning or evening of day 3, you will be returned to the airport to catch your flight home.

What a great way to get your hair back!

'Vive La Différence'

The following information should help illustrate the primary differences between the Choi technique and conventional 'micro' surgery.

Conventional Micro and Mini 'Slit' Grafting

Conventional surgery involves the insertion of 2/3 hair 'mini' and 'micro' grafts into a slit in the scalp made with a scalpel. This method requires that an equivalent space (the size of the grafts themselves) be left around each of the grafts to ensure that the blood supply to the new grafts is not compromised. Placing the 2/3 hair slit-grafts too close together can cause graft 'strangulation' and subsequent graft 'failure' with the grafts competing against each other for blood supply. Consequently, the surgery must be performed in a minimum of two visits or more (at 6 monthly intervals). Repeat visits to 'in-fill' the original 'spaced' grafts are required to give more volume.

The Costs of conventional surgery

The average operating team in the UK comprises one doctor and two, possibly three, assistants. Up to 1,000 grafts are about the maximum that UK clinics can achieve in one session and they would require most of the day to achieve them. Most clinics would suggest that this size procedure be performed over two visits - 600 grafts on the first visit, 400 on the second. If they do undertake the 1,000 grafts procedure, 4/500 of the grafts will, by necessity, need to contain single hairs. Single hair transplanting is essential in order to reproduce a 'natural looking' front hairline.

The remaining grafts will contain 2/3 hair units. Even assuming that they all contained 3 hairs, the subsequent number of growing hairs from the 1,000-graft procedure would be in the region of 2,000 hairs. This is sufficient to treat the front third section of an average size head.

As Senior Patient Counsellor at varying times for three of the leading UK's leading clinics, I know from experience that you would expect to pay somewhere in the region of £3,500 to £4,000 for a 1,000 grafts procedure. You could then be faced with a similar expense some 6 months later, particularly if you have extensive hair loss, are discerning and wish to

achieve an aesthetically excellent result. Even so, the final result with microsurgery cannot achieve the close proximity transplanting that the implanter method can.

The 'Choi' Implanter

As with mini and micro grafting, the 'Choi' Implanter utilises donor hair from the thickest part of the scalp, midway between the nape of the neck and the lower crown. Thereafter, the Choi procedure bears little resemblance to its forerunner, the scalpel.

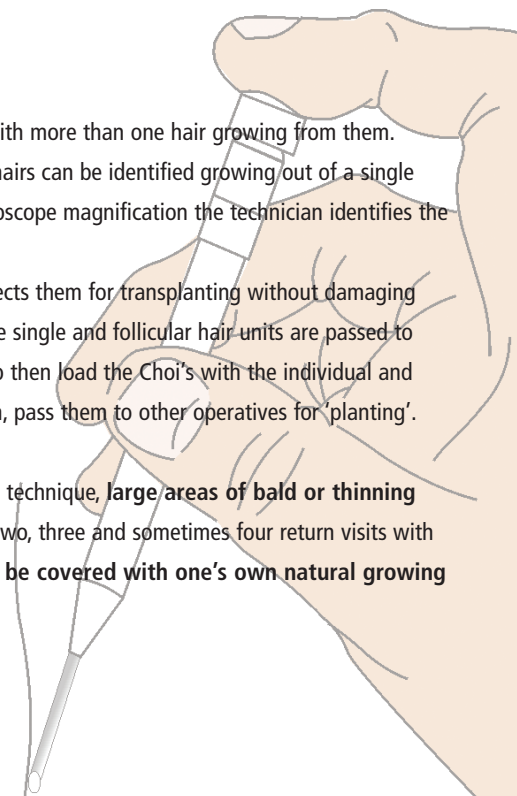
The 'Choi' Implanter closely resembles a hypodermic. Single and multiple hair units, (follicular units) containing 2-4 hairs growing from a single root, are 'loaded' roots down into the instrument and then 'injected' into incisions the surgeon has already prepared with a needle.

Similarly to micro's, it is necessary to leave space between the single and follicular grafts but with the Choi this is only the width of an 18-gauge needle. As such, the new hairs can be placed almost as close together as your original growth and there is no need for a repeat session six months later.

Follicular units

Follicular units are roots with more than one hair growing from them. Anything between 2 to 4 hairs can be identified growing out of a single root. Under powerful microscope magnification the technician identifies the multiple hair roots (called 'bundles') and dissects them for transplanting without damaging their growth potential. The single and follicular hair units are passed to members of the team, who then load the Choi's with the individual and multiple units. They, in turn, pass them to other operatives for 'planting'.

Using this state-of-the-art- technique, **large areas of bald or thinning scalp, normally requiring two, three and sometimes four return visits with conventional grafting, can be covered with one's own natural growing hair in just one visit.**



Post Operative Swelling (Oedema).

It has generally been common, to have a certain amount of swelling (Oedema) to the forehead and around the eyes. This would last anything between 3 to 5 days after the procedure. Naturally, it caused considerable inconvenience to hair transplant patients. In fact, some patients would wait weeks or even months, before choosing a date for their procedures. Ideally, for a time when they could afford to take a little more time to allow for the 4 or 5 days it often took for the swelling to subside.

No More Post Operative Swelling! - It's certainly looks that way?

Due to a number of very positive changes over recent months, our medical team in Athens have now virtually eradicated Post Operative Swelling - The forehead swelling, (generally followed by black eyes) which invariably appears after a hair transplant procedure when the front scalp has been treated.

Now, this whole scenario would appear to be part of the past. - How've we done it?

Swift, Competent, Experienced, Teamwork.

By working straight through the patient's session without unnecessary breaks, our surgeon and his team have reduced the time it takes for the average Choi procedure by up to a third.

Naturally, reducing the session times significantly reduces the amount of anaesthetic generally required by the patient. As the anaesthetic itself is the main contributing factor to Post Operative Swelling - The less you have, the better the chance of avoiding swelling.

It also means that our big session, often taking up to 6 hours in the past, can now be comfortably achieved within 4 hours. The smaller session reduce in length accordingly.

No unnecessary breaks - Less anaesthesia - Virtually no postoperative swelling

Choi Implanter – the Costs

Being a needle, the Choi allows single hairs to be placed very much closer together and the required density can be achieved in just one visit, whereas Micro grafting requires a minimum of two visits at 6 monthly intervals.

I am offering three sizes of sessions - even our smaller session is considered a mega session by UK standards.

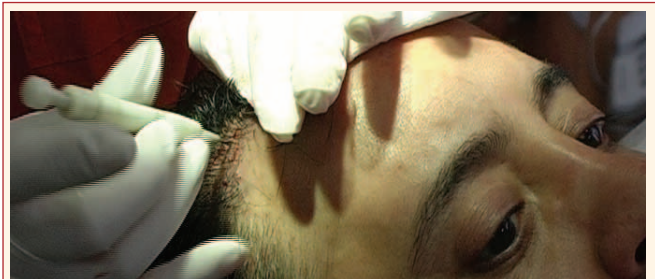
- **The mini mega session** — for up to 3,000 hairs (approx. 1500 follicular hair grafts)

Typically, this would be suitable for the patient wishing to replace a specific area, say the front half section of the scalp, or an area of considerable crown baldness. This size session (subject to donor hair availability) would also be ideal for the patient who wants to add thickness to his remaining hair or to a previous 'micro' hair transplant. This session costs £4,000

- **The midi mega session** – From 3000, up to 4500 hairs (approx. 1500 to 2250 follicular hair grafts). This size session (subject to donor hair availability) is recommended for cover from the front hairline to just short of the crown of the head. This session costs £5,000

- **The large mega session** – from 4500 to 6000 hairs (3000 follicular hair grafts)

This size session (subject to donor hair availability) is recommended for the patient with severe hair loss or a general thinning all the way through the top scalp and where sufficient donor hair is available to provide the necessary cover. This session costs £6,000.

I flew out from Manchester on Saturday with Olympic Airlines, had the Choi procedure Monday and returned home on Thursday as I quite fancied the full Athens tour. Arriving home feeling fit and well rested, thanks to Malcolm and his team, from Maria the Clinical Nurse to Jeff and Mike the driver who guided me around Athens and the tourist sites, great shopping facilities and the surrounding coves and beaches.

In the beginning” there was the plug. And man saw this was good. And indeed it was “good”, for its time. Man had some coverage of their baldness for the first time. The results for the individual patients however remained as a testament to its crudeness; a cobbling effect which clearly indicated that they had had some sort of cosmetic procedure. This obviously militated against the reason for having the procedure in the first place; although not being seen as bald but now being seen as having an obvious cosmetic procedure. Hence patients contention that they would rather be bald and at least look natural than wanting to look like they had been shot in the head with a shotgun at close range!!

As hair technology advanced so did the tools used on Hair Restoration. The “micro surgery” technique was developed. Without going into technical and minor details, suffice to say that this was a vast improvement on the plug method but it still had its drawback. Lack of density and the need for multiple sessions over a long period of time were some of the considerations. The lack of a presentable and “natural looking” hairline was another significant drawback. The effects were similar to that of the plug method - An unnatural and obvious cosmetic procedure. Obvious to state that the benefits for the patients (converge) were countered/negated by the fact that one looked like they had a cosmetic procedure - Unnatural and obvious.

Then came the Choi. The saviour of the world! (in Hair circles anyway). A precise tool. The cutting edge of technology! The use of this device, in the right hands could lead to some remarkably natural looking results, which blended into existing areas to give a totally natural overall result.

Now we come to the crux of the matter. Notice, in relation to the Choi I said “in the right hands’. There was an important reason for this as I will explain.

The Choi is a device, a tool. It is adjunct to therapy and not the therapy itself. Give an ordinary child some paints and canvas and he will give you a rather nice interpretation of “art”. Give the same materials to an accomplished artist and he will give you a masterpiece.

So is the same for the usage of the Choi. A tool whose expression and potential lies in the hands of the practitioner. And as we know in art, both expression, result and technical expertise vary greatly. In Cosmetic surgery the same rule is true. Results vary greatly depending on the surgeon himself, even though they use the same device.

Let me now proudly introduce to you the “National Portrait Gallery” of Hair Restoration in the form of Choi Hair Restoration Clinics and Fotis Tunis, the Leonardo De Vinci of our time.
